

Major Research Project (MRP) /Dissertation

The preparation of a Major Research Project (MRP)/Dissertation is a systematic process that starts in the IV term and finishes with the defence of the final dissertation at a viva-voce examination. To get the satisfactory results it is important to work consistently, gradually developing the idea by reading and analysing the literature, developing methodology for the empirical research, data collection, and analysis of data, citing case examples, and preparing the final report.

Major Research Projects are aimed at instilling academic rigour, ability to scientifically explore various issues, and application of Business Research Methods. Therefore students are advised to choose a topic for Academic Research. Industry Sponsored Projects or Extension Summer Internship Projects will not be considered for MRP/Dissertation

Major Research Project/Dissertation (MRP) will be equivalent to a course of 3 credits.

Second Year Students will be provided a detailed guidelines before commencement of IV term.
